The ARC of Yates is bouncing back!



Seventeen months later, the ARC of Yates is moving back into its headquarters on Sheppard Street in Penn Yan. A **ribbon cutting ceremony planned for Monday, October 5th at 10 AM** was announced by the ARC's new CEO, **Daniele Lyman**, during her presentation to the Club today. She was accompanied by her VP for Advancement and Rotarian (Canandaigua) Taryn Windheim. Daniele's background includes 15 years of experience in public and non-profit agencies, the ARC of Monroe and several years as an adjunct at St. John Fisher

Daniele shared the four points of her agency's new strategic plan: establish and maintain financial sustainability; enhance and expand micro-businesses; use new programs to create paths that any person with any range of abilities could pursue; and increase community engagement.

Daniele is clearly experienced and enthusiastic; and is a former member of Rochester Rotary. She is fighting to move ARC away from being the best-kept-secret in Yates County. She hopes that Taryn will transfer from the Canandaigua club to be part of ours. Daniele sees the ARC collaborating in service projects to enhance the community while involving ARC clients...such as a recent project painting outdoor benches in Dundee.

She reminded us that the ARC was founded by concerned parents of children with needs 40 years ago and on November 13th they are holding an anniversary party at Anthony Road Winery. Today, the ARC serves adults, seniors and children with different abilities. Pre-school and early intervention is a critical focus. At times they are a referral agent, connecting individual with those who can serve them further. The ARC operates supported employment, group homes, and work counseling. They operate a transport service as well.

Daniele joined when the agency was fighting back from the flood. 150 individuals were displaced from their primary facility on Sheppard Street to various places nearby. FEMA and the State finally are helping. They are returning to a newly renovated and extensively flood-proofed building this week. The rededication/ribbon cutting is Monday morning at 10 AM. We are all invited.

"It is time to put the flood behind us and to move on with our strategies." Sounds great!!!

A little taste of Rotary in Ireland and the British Isles:

Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland (RIBI) is the association of Rotary clubs within England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland. RIBI has over 1,800 clubs consisting of more than 50,000 men and women.

Like us, they help at food banks, assist those affected by flooding, and fundraise for local hospices and other charities. While we host ONSEYAWA, they are much more into organizing sports tournaments for disabled youngsters and running something called memory cafés.

They also organize a program of camps and exchanges for High School graduates. Applicants enroll for an opportunity to travel abroad for several

weeks in the summer to develop an understanding of a different culture, to acquire a taste for a future career, or to engage in an in-depth service project. Their websites promote the traditional youth exchange that we know, “handicamps” and exchanges mentioned above.

The RIBI district 1160 has an interesting project in Rombo, Kenya, which lies at the foot of Mt. Kilimanjaro on the Kenyan side of the Tanzanian border. It is a home to the Maasai tribe.

It is also home to a woman from Ireland, Elaine Bannon, a Paul Harris Fellow. She has built a “volunteers’ house” there. Rotarians from her home district are encouraged to go visit her, help save or enrich the lives of villagers and promote peace and worldwide understanding. The Irish district governor has set a goal that at least one member from each club in the district will visit Rotarian Bannon and volunteer for some form of service in the village.
