

## *World Peace Scholars*

As we award our Keuka Scholarship, we should note that each year, Rotary selects up to 100 individuals from around the world to receive fully funded academic fellowships at one of Rotary's peace centers. These fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

In just over a decade, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 900 fellows for careers in peace building. Many of them go on to serve as leaders in national governments, NGOs, the military, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and World Bank.

For most it leads to a Master's degree following study at premier universities in fields related to peace and conflict prevention and resolution. Programs last 15 to 24 months and require a practical internship of two to three months during the academic break. Each year, we award up to 50 master's degree fellowships at these institutions:

- Duke University and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, USA
- International Christian University, Japan
- University of Bradford, England
- University of Queensland, Australia
- Uppsala University, Sweden

## *Geneva Rotary's Santa Train*

Guest **Ken Steadman** says that Geneva Rotary is running the Rotary Santa Train Express again...a unique holiday experience for children and families. This year, five trains will run on Saturday, December 12.

This year Rotary is collecting hats and mittens on the day of the trains, and if you bring a pair of mittens or a hat you will receive a free cup of hot chocolate. Rotary will donate all of the hats and mittens to Gloves of Love.

Santa and Mrs. Claus will be aboard and will meet the children individually. Each child will receive a coloring book, a box of crayons and a candy cane. A holiday sing-along will be held during each trip. There will be food available for purchase the day of the event.

The trains will board in downtown Geneva adjacent to the Public Safety Building on Railroad Place, just off Exchange Street. Trains will depart promptly at 10 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 1 p.m., 2:30 p.m. and a special Pajama Train at 4 p.m. The actual boarding time will be 15 minutes before the scheduled departure time for any train. Refreshments will be available at the boarding area, but not on the train.

Tickets cost \$18 per person with lap sitters riding free. All tickets this year will be sold through the Smith Center for the Arts and can be purchased; on line at [tickets@thesmith.org](mailto:tickets@thesmith.org), at the Smith box office, 82 Seneca Street, Geneva or by calling the Smith at 315-781-5483. Box Office hours are Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. You must bring your email confirmation to the event. This confirmation is your boarding pass.
